Shining STARS: Life-Saving Award **Congratulations to Healthcare Protection Officer, Bryon Garrett!**



At about 1400 hours, HPO Bryon Garrett and an APO responded to the "Richmond Assist" in the roundabout area outside the main entrance of the Emergency Department. The patient, a 70year-old female was unresponsive in the vehicle and clinical staff requested assistance. HPO Garrett and the APO were able to remove

the patient from the vehicle and place her in a wheelchair. The officers quickly rushed the patient into the ED where CPR was initiated for about 15minutes which resulted in the patient being revived. Due to their quick response and efforts, the patient is now recovering and should make a full recovery.
